


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

To begin, let me tell you about a story that I wrote,

BARTHOLOMEW BALDERDASH AND THE KINDNESS MACHINE.




A young inventor named Bartholomew Balderdash dreams of doing something big and important.

When Queen Beneficent offers a reward to anyone who can restore kindness to her

kingdom he decides to invent a Big and Important Kindness Machine.

Along the way, he discovers that it's often the smallest acts of kindness that make the biggest difference.





Did you know that every story has three parts?

Beginning Middle End

But what should go in each part?



Well...

1. BEGINNING

At the beginning of the story we start with a main character who wants something and feels a certain way.

2. MIDDLE

Something gets in the way of the character getting what they want.

3. END

The character changes or learns something at the end of the story. They also feel differently from how they did at the beginning.



Here's how it worked in BARTHOLOMEW BALDERDASH AND THE KINDNESS MACHINE

1. THE BEGINNING

WHAT DOES THE MAIN CHARACTER WANT? HOW DOES THE MAIN CHARACTER FEEL?



BARTHOLOMEW BALDERDASH AND THE KINDNESS MACHINE has one main character, Bartholomew.

What does he want?

He wants to create a Big and Important Kindness Machine to prove that he is a fantastic inventor.

How does he feel?

He feels challenged.



2. THE MIDDLE

WHAT GETS IN HIS WAY?

Bartholomew must help many people before he can gather the parts for his machine. He helps a librarian, an actor, a baker, and a group of crying children. Finally he ends up leaving his machine behind so children can play with it.




3. THE END

HOW DOES THE MAIN CHARACTER CHANGE?

Bartholomew realizes that he didn't need a machine to do something big and important. Sometimes the smallest acts of kindness can make the biggest difference.





